1. Session times are stated in the column on the far left. An alternative time may be indicated next to the unit's name. *Notes in purple* are for BTh students (seminarians).
2. All units are 9 credit points (cpts) unless otherwise indicated.
3. Students in the latter part of their course may enquire with the Registrar about generic units (undertaken by special arrangement with a member of Faculty) such as Independent Guided Study, Research Projects, and Research Essays etc.
4. Chapel services are conducted for the benefit of staff and students. All are welcome.
5. Chapel services marked * include a 2 min sermon on the saint of the day (by junior seminarians by rotation) and 2 min sermon on a verse from the day's epistle reading (by senior seminarians by rotation).
6. [] denotes the year level to which the unit refers to as a general rule for students whose home institution is St Andrew's, e.g. [1] denotes a typical unit for first year BTh students; [D] for Diploma of Christian Studies; [G] for graduate-level students (i.e. GradCertA, GradDipA, MA); [H] for BTh(Hons) and MTh. **Interested students external to St Andrew's should read the footer for more precise definitions and consult the Registrar.**

The first two letters indicate the field of study for which the unit is accredited: AL=Humanities; BB=Biblical Studies; CN=Counselling (*cross-assignable to PT*); HS=Church History; LS=Liturgical Studies; PT=Pastoral Theology; TH=Theology. The three digit number indicates the degree for which the course unit is accredited and, accordingly, its required assessment demands: 100-300 levels = DipChSt and BTh; 400-500 levels = GradCertA, GradDipA and MA; 600-700 levels = BTh (Hons) and MTh. See the *Handbook* for the structure of each course of study and the relevant listing of assignable units.
